

## **Update for the Parishioners of Our Lady of Angels:**

Thank you for your prayers and concerns for Father Vives and all the priests of Our Lady of Angels. The following is an update on our situation. First, we continue to place the safety of our parishioners first. Father Vives continues in isolation through today, Tuesday. He is safe to return to pastoral activities tomorrow per the CDC's guidelines (10 days from the onset of symptoms. See <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/if-you-are-sick/end-home-isolation.html> )

Out an abundance of caution, Fathers Montero and Marsal sought tests. Both were negative, and both show no sign of symptoms. Again, out of caution, they stayed out of parish activities through today, Tuesday, but will return to the office tomorrow since it will be over 10 days since Father Vives tested positive. Fathers Ribera and Espino are available for any sacramental needs.

Furthermore, the church was cleaned on Saturday prior to weekend Masses. The church office was cleaned prior to today's opening.

We have notified persons with whom Father Vives thinks he had close contact. (Close contact is defined as being with someone infected at less than 6 feet for more than 15 minutes.)

If you have questions or concerns, you will receive the most prompt response if you reach out to the parish office.

We conclude, by asking all of you to continue praying to Our Lord and Our Lady of Angels for protection from the illness and a safe recovery for those infected.
